I. COURSE DESCRIPTION 課程簡介

A systematic study of Christian doctrines according to the evangelical tradition. Topics covered include prolegomena, revelation and the doctrine of the Word, the doctrines of God, creation, and humanity. Special emphases are placed upon the application of these doctrines in evangelism, apologetics, pastoral ministries, missiological considerations and theological contextualization.

- 1.1. Students will develop a comprehensive and in-depth understanding and appreciation of the Christian Doctrines of Theological Method, Bibliology, Doctrine of God, Creationism, and Anthropology.

C. ASSIGNMENTS AND GRADING 作業及評核

1. Class Participation: Attendance, Discussion, Assigned Readings (10%)

The students are required to read the assigned texts and class notes according to the class schedule and prepare to interact in class with other student.

This assignment develops the Learning Outcome 1.1 concerning the development of the student's cognitive understanding about formulating a consistent system of theology.

3. Final Exam: (50%)

This final exam is an opportunity for the student to share insights gleaned over the duration of the course. There will be no new or surprise questions, only those encountered and discussed at length during the course. The exam preparation should be very straightforward, as the student is simply expected to integrate our course discussions, and present final responses to the questions we have discussed in class.

Turnitin Text-Matching Software

Upon submission, you will receive a summary that includes your submitted files along with a similarity report generated by Turnitin. Please be aware that Turnitin can also detect AI-generated content from tools like Grammarly, so students should be mindful of when using such software. Research Ethics

All course-based assignments involving human participants requires ethical review and may require approval by the [Tyndale Research Ethics Board \(REB\)](#). Check with the Seminary Dean's Office (aa@tyndale.ca) before proceeding.

Late Papers and Extensions Policy

All papers and course assignments must be submitted by the due dates indicated in the course syllabus. Unless the instructor already has a policy on grading late papers in the course syllabus, grades for papers submitted late without an approved extension will be lowered at the rate of two-thirds of a grade per week or part thereof (e.g., from "A+" to "A-," from "B" to "C+"). Please note that some programs, such as cohort-based or intensive courses, may follow a different policy due to the nature of the program.

Faculty may not grant an extension beyond the last day of exams for the semester. Requests for extensions beyond this date must be addressed in writing to the Registrar by filling out the [Extension Request Form](#). The application will be considered only in cases such as a death in the family, medical emergency, hospitalization of oneself or immediate family member or prolonged illness requiring treatment by a physician. Factors such as assignments for other courses, holidays, and technology-related difficulties are insufficient grounds for requesting an extension.

A temporary grade of incomplete ("I") may be granted by the Registrar. A grade of "F" will be recorded for students who do not complete the outstanding work by the deadline.
