I. COURSE DESCRIPTION 課程簡介

Revised: July 3, 2025

This course is an introduction to the systematic study of Christian doctrines according to the Evangelical tradition. Historical and thematic aspects are explored in each major Christian doctrine of Christology, Soteriology, Pneumatology, Ecclesiology and Eschatology. The course equips pastors, missionaries and Christian leaders to serve the Chinese Church. Special emphasis is placed on the application of these doctrines in the Christian life, mission, pastoral ministries and theological contextualizaton. Class discussions and assignments are designed to encourage the students to apply the contents of the course in these related fields.

C. ASSIGNMENTS AND GRADING 作業及評核

1. Class Participation: Attendance, Discussion, Assigned Readings (10%)Students are required to read the assigned texts and class notes according to the class schedule and prepare to interact in class with other students. 教室内的參與: 出席、討論、作業。

2. Critical reflection on the reading materials (40%)Read through the assigned reading materials and write 4 critical reflections, 1000 words each (10% each), on a specified theme of the assigned reading materials. This assignment develops the students' in-depth understanding and the ability to critically reflect on various theological issues. It is related to Learning Outcomes 1.1, 2 and 3.2.

3. Research Paper on an issue of a selected doctrine (word limit: 5000 words) (50%) Students will identify a specific theological issue covered in this course (except in the area covered by the book report), based on a major theologian or a theological concern within their context. The paper should demonstrate thoughtful reflection, critical analysis, and applications of the concepts in relevant Chinese contexts. It should include at least 8 good quality academic sources, and written in scholarly format with proper footnotes and bibliography. This assignment is related to Learning Outcomes 1, 2 and 3.

Upon submission, you will receive a summary that includes your submitted

files along with a similarity report generated by Turnitin. Please be aware that Turnitin can also detect AI-generated content from tools like Grammarly, so students should be mindful of when using such software. Research Ethics

All course-based assignments involving human participants requires ethical review and may require approval by the <u>Tyndale Research Ethics Board (REB)</u>. Check with the Seminary Dean's Office (<u>aau@tyndale.ca</u>) before proceeding.

Late Papers and Extensions Policy

All papers and course assignments must be submitted by the due dates indicated in the course syllabus. Unless the instructor already has a policy on grading late papers in the course syllabus, grades for papers submitted late without an approved extension will be lowered at the rate of two-thirds of a grade per week or part thereof (e.g., from "A+" to "A-," from "B" to "C+"). Please note that some programs, such as cohort-based or intensive courses, may follow a different policy due to the nature of the program.

Faculty may not grant an extension beyond the last day of exams for the semester. Requests for extensions beyond this date must be addressed in writing to the Registrar by filling out the Extension Request Form. The application will be considered only in cases such as a death in the family, medical emergency, hospitalization of oneself or immediate family member or prolonged illness requiring treatment by a physician. Factors such as assignments for other courses, holidays, and technology-related difficulties are insufficient grounds for requesting an extension.

A temporary grade of incomplete ("I") may be granted by the Registrar. Once an extension is granted, it is the student's responsibility to contact the instructor and make satisfactory arrangements to complete the outstanding work. A grade of "F" will be recorded for students who do not complete the outstanding work by the deadline.
